Expect routine handwashing, shoes sanitizing, and face covering use for all those age 2 and over.



More outdoor activities.



Ventilation improvements: HEPA filters, open windows, etc.

What to Expect



Dropping off and picking up kids will mean wearing face coverings, staying outside, or in the car.



Bay Area Community Health

A COVID-19 vaccine clinic hosted by Bay Area Community Health will be held in Fremont. The clinics are only offering shots for those aged 65 years and older. Click <u>HERE</u> to schedule an appointment or call <u>510-770-8040</u>.

Oakland Coliseum Mass Vaccination Site

A vaccination megasite sponsored by the Federal and State Government is now open at the Oakland Coliseum seven days a week from 9:00 AM to 7:00 PM. You must sign up for appointments in advance at the State's My Turn website or by calling calling <u>833-422-4255</u>. Registrants must qualify for the vaccine under current State guidelines, which includes those 65 years and older, frontline workers, long-term care providers and educators.

Alameda County Fairgrounds

The County of Alameda joined Stanford Health Care - ValleyCare and Sutter Health has launched a large-scale, drive-thru vaccination clinic to serve Alameda County residents and health care workers. COVID-19 vaccination appointments will be available Wednesday through Saturday for Alameda County health care workers and residents aged 65 and older. The site will also be able to open to essential workers in the Food/Agriculture, Education/Childcare, and Emergency Services sectors. Drive-thru lanes will be available for each vaccination provider.

- Alameda County: Open 8 a.m. 4:30 p.m., appointments are by invitation only at this time due to limited vaccine supply.

- Sutter Health: Sutter patients may schedule appointments online or by calling (844) 987-6115.

Tiburcio Vasquez Health Center

CVS

CVS is accepting appointments for free COVID-19 vaccinations throughout the State of California. Eligibility is based on the State's eligibility guidelines, which for now includes Phase 1a: health care workers and residents 65 and older and staff of long-term care facilities. They are routinely adding new appointments, so please check back often on <u>CVS website</u>.

Kaiser Permanente

Kaiser Permanente is currently vaccinating health care workers, residents of long-term care facilities, and people 75 and older. As appointments become available, we'll reach out to members between the ages of 65 and 74 – focusing on those at highest risk of exposure or complications due to COVID-19. Find out about supply increases and appointment availability as it changes on their dedicated vaccine website or call the KP InfoLine at <u>1-855-550-0951</u> (available in English and Spanish) 24/7.

Sutter Health

Sutter Health is vaccinating patients age 65 and older and healthcare workers. Call <u>(844) 987-6115 to make an appointment or book online on their website</u>.

Stanford Health

Stanford Health Care is currently vaccinating health care workers who work in Alameda County and patients who have received care at Stanford Health Care at least once in the last three years, are aged 65+, and live in Alameda County. Washington Hospital

Washington Hospital Healthcare System is ONLY offering the vaccine to the following eligible individuals:

Washington Township Health Care District residents who are 65 and older Washington Township Medical Foundation patients who are 65 and older Employees and physicians of the Washington Hospital Healthcare System and other eligible health care professionals, per Alameda County Public Health Department guidelines

Washington Township Medical Foundation patients who meet the criteria to be vaccinated can schedule vaccination appointments through their personal <u>MyChart account.</u> Community members can inquire about eligibility and appointments by calling our COVID-19 vaccination phone line at <u>510.248.8200</u>, but please note that we are experiencing extremely long wait times in our call center.

Walgreens
